Enterprise is about the ability to be self motivated, creative, to be an effective participator, independent yet able to work in a team, reflective and essentially be able to take the lead in life's choices and decisions.

Enterprise and Personal Learning and Thinking Skills (PLTS) have a number of similarities and can co exist to support one another in the curriculum. At UBHS we have mapped all of these skills into our PRIDE charter.

Principles

At UBHS we want to enable all learners to have an equal opportunity to access Enterprise Learning through a range of learning mediums thereby equipping them with the skills, knowledge and attributes to be successful both in the world of work and in their personal lives.

We want to achieve this aim through:

- Increasing learners' self-confidence, motivation & commitment to learning.
- Encouraging positive attitudes to life-long learning in students and staff
- Providing an enterprise learning environment in which learners are encouraged to take the initiative and teachers take the role of coach / facilitator
- Providing a means of supporting learners to become independent learners through a focus on self reflection, thinking skills, problem solving, decision-making & goal setting
- Ensure that an extensive range of activities are delivered within the school allowing our pupils to acquire entrepreneurial skills.
- Promote a culture of enterprise and creativity throughout the school to enable all pupils to contribute effectively to their own skills development.
- Developing quality links with a range of local business and community contacts.

Implementation

We will achieve these aims through:

- Acknowledging and encouraging participation in local and national events related to enterprise
- Delivering extra-curricular activities which help develop the pupils enterprise capability
- Providing a combination of whole year group, optional and targeted provision
- Promotion of Enterprise & celebrating achievement through school publications, assemblies, staff meetings, displays and the school website
- Initiating whole school, year group and other groupings with specific enterprise activities
- Participation in Enterprise Week by all learners
